Bastrop Public Library Board Meeting Minutes

November 4, 2019

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Mary Jo Jenkins.

Members present were

Mary Jo Jenkins, Barbara Clemons, Jamie McDonald, Jennifer Leisure, Sally Keinarth, Rebecca Bennett, Mayor Connie Schroeder, and Library Director Becca Sexton. Lesa Neese notified by email that she would not be able to attend.

Citizen Comments:

There were none.

Announcements:

The Board training was held last week.

Mary Jo Jenkins thanked those who helped with the Halloween Festival.

Staff Report:

Becca Sexton and Bonnie met with the Bastrop Audubon Society to work on programming toward having Bastrop designated a Bird City.

The Library staff are currently working on applying for Erate funding, which reimburses the Library for Internet access.

The average attendance at Books and Babies is 13, and there were 80 patrons at the Fire Safety day. The Teens' Dungeons and Dragons activity is now its own program in addition to the regular Teen program. There are now two Chess Clubs, one for children and one for adults.

The Fall Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon is this Thursday 11-1.

The Library will be closed this Saturday for Hotrods and Heroes in the parking lot.

Repair work will begin on the window leak.

The Library is no longer taking donations for bricks and tiles. However, since there was a backlog of 17 bricks and one tile a vendor has been engaged to complete these.

The delivery and payment problems with the Austin American-Statesman have been resolved.

The 3D printer is still not working. There is no warranty and no service plan. Becca Sexton is still trying to find a qualified repairman.

The Boards and Commissions banquet is Nov. 14.

The president of the Friends of the Library has resigned and Becca Sexton will assist them in recruiting a new president.

The statistics and the Library Board fund are included in the Agenda packet. There were no questions.

Consent Agenda:

The October minutes were approved with corrections.

Items for Individual Consideration and Discussion:

The nominating committee, represented by Barbara Clemons, put forth a slate of candidates:

President – Mary Jo Jenkins Vice President – Barbara Clemons Secretary – Rebecca Bennett

A motion to accept the slate and elect the candidates was approved.

No bylaws have been located. Because the City Council will consider a new ordinance governing Boards and Commissions at their meeting on Nov. 12, the item was tabled.

All Board members (except those who will not be available) have signed up to volunteer at the Holiday Open House. Volunteers will receive an email reminder. Board members are each asked to bring three dozen cookies, and they are further asked to recruit three friends to bring cookies.

Updates:

The non-resident fee for a Library card was arrived at by benchmarking what other area libraries charge their non-resident patrons. Non-residents with a TexShare card can check out up to five materials without paying for a Bastrop Library card.

According to the American Library Association calculator, the Bastrop Public Library provides \$4.8 million worth of programming each year. The Library staff will be working on communicating to the public the value of a library card.

The recent complete inventory found that about 1300 items are unaccounted for. Becca Sexton reported that this is a reasonable number considering that the Library has never done a complete inventory before. As the staff looks for items that have been mis-shelved, they expect that number to fall.

Bastrop Public Library Librarian's Report December 2, 2019

1. Meetings and Training

November 5: Library Director Becca Sexton attended the monthly Rotary Luncheon. Norman Jones of the Rotary presented on public library makerspaces.

November 12: Becca and Programs Supervisor Bonnie Pierson met with Terry Moore from the YMCA about a 2020 partnership with St. David's to provide quarterly wellness programs. The Library will provide a meeting space and activities for children.

November 12: Becca attended a training on the Texas State Library and Archives Commission Annual Report for public libraries, which will open in January.

November 12: Becca presented to City Council on the federal eRate program. Council approved our participation in the program, which will provide the Library a rebate of approximately \$10,000 on internet service for the July 2019—June 2020 year.

November 14: Becca and Technical and Circulation Services Supervisor Ashley Guerrero attended the City's annual Boards & Commissions banquet.

November 15: Becca and Bonnie met with representatives from the Bastrop County Audubon Society to discuss an upcoming programming partnership based around the Great Backyard Bird Count 2020.

November 20: Becca attended the monthly meeting of Bastrop County Community Organizations Active in Disaster (BCCOAD).

November 26: Becca will be presenting a resolution of support of the Bastrop County 2020 Census Complete Count Committee to the Bastrop City Council.

The Programming team (Bonnie, Bethany Dietrich, Carmen Serna, and Cary Kittrell) completed an American Library Association webinar series on "Patron-Driven Programing."

2. Programs

This month, an average of 8 people a week have attended the Library's Babies 'n' Books storytime for infants age 0—18 months.

25 children and 14 adults came to Lego Club on Tuesday, November 19.



We had a full house for the adult Crafters Anonymous program this month. Twelve people showed up to make ceramic tile coasters using Sharpies.





Nine teens attended Bethany's book club with Bastrop High School's Gay-Straight Alliance on November 21.

42 students and teachers from Cavalry Aftercare have come to the library on Monday afternoons this month to hear stories and check out books.

Youth Volunteer Club did not meet this month because the library was closed on Saturday, November 9, for Hot Rods 'n' Heroes.

30 people came to Thanksgiving storytime on Wednesday, November 20, where kids of all ages got to get up and do the Turkey Cheer.

3. Noteworthy Items

The library has ongoing issues with the vendor we use for magazine subscriptions. Library Assistant Catherine Lombardo has been working diligently to track, report, and correct the problem of repeatedly missing issues. Fortunately, she was also able to obtain several quotes and we will be changing vendors this year.

Thanks to help from community hobbyists Norman Jones and Roy Mast, Teen Library Bethany Dietrich was able to get the 3D printer up and running again.

On November 7, the Library hosted its annual Volunteer Appreciation Soup Potluck. More than 20 volunteers came to enjoy good soup and great company. Library staff enjoyed this opportunity to recognize our volunteers and all they do for us and the community.



Library staff have been hard at work on the implementing the nonresident fee. This includes working with the Finance and IT departments to install credit card readers; working with the City's Media team on an informational campaign that will include a mailer to non-resident users and print and digital publicity; and updating user types and circulation rules in our Integrated Library System (ILS).

The federal eRate program year runs July—June. This month, Becca submitted the paperwork for a rebate for service provided in the first quarter, July—September. She

also began the process of applying for funds for next year by posting a request for bids for internet service.

November 2019 Google Review: "The artist Caroline Walker told me that I needed to check out this library, and wow was she right about that! Not only did I find her own sculpture, but I also found art from the late Lee Groff, two toads by Clint Howard, a sculpture by Anthony St. James, and even a model train set donated by the late Robert Standley. One thing that could be improved is definitely the Internet, as it was painfully slow, but the library is well worth the stop for anyone passing through."

The family of Anne Beck asked mourners to give to one of several Bastrop nonprofits in lieu of flowers. As of November 20, the Library has received \$125 in cash donations from individuals, as well as a donation of several books related to Texas from the Daughters of the Republic of Texas.

Bastrop Public Library Update on Macmillan eBook Embargo December 2, 2019

- 1. On July 25, 2019, Macmillan, one of the "Big Five" publishers, announced that it would begin embargoing library e-books, effective November 1.
- 2. Upon publication, libraries will be eligible to buy a single "perpetual access" copy at half price. After eight weeks, libraries can buy additional copies at full price and under a license that expires after two years or 52 checkouts, whichever comes first.
- 3. The average cost of a Macmillan eBook is \$60.
- 4. Bastrop Public Library is part of an eBook lending consortium which includes more than 50 other libraries. The Consortium will, as a whole, be able to buy a single copy at the discounted price at publication, not one per library.
