professional maintenance, landscaping, mowing and irrigation services for the Hunters Crossing Subdivision located at East State Highway 71 and State Highway 304. However, the LGC reserves the right to purchase services from the next two lowest proposers should the primary vendor (best value proposer) be unable to supply the requirements of the City. The next highest ranked proposer shall be called, if also unable to supply, the third highest ranked proposer shall be called. If none of the three highest ranked proposers are able to supply services as required, the LGC reserves the right to purchase

services on the open market.

ORDERING: Material, if any, furnished under this contract shall be ordered by the

issuance of a purchase order by the City of Bastrop.

**CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT:** Either party may terminate this contract with a thirty (30) day written

notice.

# INTENT

It is the intent of these specifications to describe the professional maintenance, landscaping, mowing and irrigation services for the Hunters Crossing Subdivision located at East State Highway 71 and State Highway 304 for which the LGC is requesting proposals, in order to establish an annual contract. The contract awarded as a result of this Request for Proposal shall be for a period of one (1) year from the date of the award. The LGC reserves the right to renew the contract for three (3) annual renewals, if it is in the City's best interest and agreed upon by the successful proposer.

# **MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS**

The LGC is requesting proposals for **BEST VALUE CONTRACT FOR MAINTENANCE**, **MOWING**, **IRRIGATION AND LANDSCAPING SERVICES FOR THE HUNTERS CROSSING SUBDIVISION LOCATED IN BASTROP**, **TEXAS**. The Scope of Work is attached as Exhibit A. Proposals must include the itemized price sheet, attached as Exhibit B, and the Proposal Submittal, attached as Exhibit C. All improvements shall meet the LGC and City of Bastrop specifications.

# **AWARD CRITERIA**

In determining which proposal offers the "best value," the city will consider the following criteria:

- Description of Contractor's experience in providing the services requested. Max. Value 20%
- Key personnel and proposed staffing plan. Max. Value 10%
- Inventory of materials, equipment and supplies to be used by the Contractor. Max. Value 10%
- A minimum of three (3) references from parties on whose behalf services of similar size and structure to the Scope of Work described in this RFP in the past five (5) years for clients with which the Contractor had two (2) or more years of successful service. Max. Value 20%
- Safety program and procedures. Max. Value 10%
- Price and sufficiency/completeness of bid information. Max. Value 30%

# INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the LGC and City, their officers, agents and employees, both past and present, from and against liability for any and all claims, liens, suits, demands, and actions for damages, injuries to persons (including death), property damage (including loss of use), and expenses, (including court costs, attorneys' fees and other reasonable costs of litigation) arising out of or resulting from Contractor's work and activities conducted in connection with or incidental to this Contract and from any liability arising out of or resulting from intentional acts or negligence of the Contractor, including all such causes of action based upon common, constitutional, or statutory law, or based in whole or in part upon the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Contractor, including but not limited to its officers, agents, employees, subcontractors, licensees, invitees, and other persons.

It is the express intention of the parties hereto, the LGC, City and Contractor, that the indemnity provided for in this Contract indemnifies and protects the LGC and City from the consequences of the Contractor's own negligence.

The Contractor further agrees that it shall at all times exercise reasonable precautions on behalf of, and be solely responsible for, the safety of its officers, agents, employees, subcontractors, licensees, invitees, and other persons, as well as their property, while in the vicinity where the work is being done. It is expressly understood and agreed that the LGC and City shall not be liable or responsible for the negligence or other fault of the Contractor, its officers, agents, employees, subcontractors, licensees, invitees, or other persons associated with the Contractor.

The Contractor agrees to indemnify and save the City harmless from all claims growing out of any demands of subcontractors, laborers, workers, mechanics, materialmen, and furnishers of supplies, equipment, financing or any other goods or services, tangible or intangible. When the City so desires, the Contractor shall furnish satisfactory evidence that all obligations of the nature hereinabove designated have been paid, discharged or waived.

#### INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Contractor acknowledges that Contractor is an independent contractor of the LGC and City and that Contractor is not an employee, agent, official or representative of the LGC or City. Contractor shall not represent, either expressly or through implication, that Contractor is an employee, agent, official or representative of the LGC or City. Income taxes, self-employment taxes, social security taxes and the like are the sole responsibility of the Contractor.

Nothing contained in this Contract shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto or by any third party to create the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture or of any association whatsoever between the parties, it being expressly understood and agreed that no provision contained in this Agreement nor any act or acts of the parties hereto shall be deemed to create any relationship between the parties other than the relationship of independent parties contracting with each other solely for the purpose of effecting the provisions of this Contract.

I understand that the indemnification and Independent Contractor provisions are requirements of all City of Bastrop Contracts. I have read the provisions and agree to the terms of these provisions.

# HUNTERS CROSSING LOCAL GOVERNMENT CORPORATION GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSERS

#### 1. ELIGIBLE PROPOSERS

Proposers are limited to those persons or firms qualified and engaged in a full time business and can assume liabilities for any performance or warranty service required.

#### 2. PROPOSAL DELIVERY

Proposals must be received in the City Secretary's office prior to the stated due date and time. It is the sole responsibility of the Proposer to ensure timely delivery of the completed RFP. The LGC and City will not be responsible for failure of service on the part of the U.S. Postal Office, courier companies, or any other form of delivery service chosen by the proposer. Late proposals will be returned to the proposer unopened.

Proposers are reminded that the U.S. Postal Service deliveries may be delayed. Proposers are responsible for on-time deliveries of proposal documents to the City of Bastrop, and are strongly encouraged to use alternate means, such as overnight/hand delivery carriers, or allow ample time for USPS deliveries to be received in time. Additionally, local courier firms and copy shops may accept fax copies, seal them and deliver to the City, for fees, for which the vendor bears responsibility.

#### 3. PROPOSAL DOCUMENTS

<u>Review of Documents</u>: Proposers are expected to examine all documents that make up the proposal. Proposers shall promptly notify the LGC of any omission, ambiguity, inconsistency or error that they may discover upon examination of the proposal. The LGC and City assume no responsibility for any errors or misrepresentations that result from the use of incomplete Proposals.

<u>Location of Documents</u>: The Department Head or designee issues RFPs. The location and phone number is specified in the RFP.

<u>Preparation of Proposal:</u> Each proposer must furnish the information required by the proposal on the documents provided. Proposals submitted on other than the forms included in the proposal package may be considered non-responsive. Any attempt to alter the wording in the proposal may result in rejection of the proposal.

<u>Taxes</u>: Purchases of goods or services for the LGC and City use are usually exempt from City, State, and most Federal Taxes. Bids may not include exempted taxes. The successful proposer should request a Tax Exemption Certificate from the Purchasing Division if needed. Under no circumstances shall the LGC or City be liable to pay taxes for which the LGC and/or City has an exemption.

**Brand Name or Equal**: If the proposal indicates brand name or "equal" products are acceptable, the proposer may proposal an "equal" product as an alternate proposal but must be prepared to demonstrate those features that render it equal. Final determination of a product as an "equal" solely remains with the City.

<u>Delivery Time</u>: Deliveries will be acceptable only during normal working hours at the designated City Municipal Facility. Delivery time, if stated as a number of days, will be based on calendar days. Time is of the essence in any LGC and City purchase. If the indicated date cannot be met, or the date is not indicated, the proposer shall state its best delivery time. Failure to meet delivery times quoted may be grounds for cancellation of contract.

<u>Prices</u>: Proposals shall be firm unless otherwise specified. In the event of a discrepancy between unit price and extended price, the unit price shall govern.

<u>Signature</u>: The proposer must sign each document in the proposal requiring a signature (when applicable). If addenda are issued, the proposer must initial any physical change made to the proposal.

<u>Bid bond</u>: If a bid bond is required for this purchase, the requirement will be reflected in the specifications of the proposal package. Cashier's check or an acceptable bid bond in the amount indicated (or in the amount of 5% of the total of the proposal submitted) must be submitted at the time the proposal is submitted. The bond company must be licensed to do business in the state of Texas.

<u>Proprietary Information</u>: All material submitted to the LGC and City becomes public property and is subject to the Texas Open Records Act upon receipt. If a proposer does not desire proprietary information in the proposal to be disclosed, each page must be identified and clearly marked proprietary at time of submittal. The LGC and City will, to the extent allowed by law, endeavor to protect such information from disclosure. The final decision as to what information must be disclosed, however, lies with the Texas Attorney General. Failure to identify proprietary information will result in all unmarked sections being deemed non-proprietary and available upon public request.

<u>Proposal Preparation Costs</u>: All costs associated with preparing a proposal in response to a proposal solicitation shall be borne by the proposer.

Payment Terms: All payment terms shall be "Net 30 Days" unless specified in the proposal document.

<u>Credentials</u>: Copies of W-9, business licenses, professional certifications or other credentials, together with evidence that Proposer, if a corporation, is in good standing and qualified to conduct business in Texas must be included in the proposal packet.

## 4. SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS

By submitting a response, each Proposer certifies that it understands this RFP and has full knowledge of: 1) the scope, nature, quality, and quantity of the work to be performed, 2) the detailed requirements of the services to be provided; and 3) the conditions under which the services are to be performed and that it had the right to ask any relevant questions prior to submission of the proposal. Each Proposer certifies that it understands that all costs relating to preparing and responding to this RFP are the sole responsibility of the Proposer. The Proposer acknowledges and understands that the contract will be awarded to the Respondent who provides the **BEST VALUE** to the LGC for these services based upon the criteria noted herein.

The Proposer shall read and understand the circumstances, requirements, and procedures under which this RFP is provided, including undertaking an inspection of the Property at issue, before submitting a proposal to the LGC and City.

Unless otherwise specified, proposers are required to submit the following:

- "original" signed proposal packet;
- one (1) **copy** of original proposal packet;
- flash drive of completed proposal packet documents

# <u>Documents Required With Proposal</u>: ALL ENCLOSED DOCUMENTS MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH PROPOSAL PRIOR TO THE DEADLINE.

Addendums: Receipt of Addendums must be acknowledged by signing and returning Addendums with the proposal, if requested. It is the proposer's responsibility to obtain, review, sign and return any and all addendums, if requested. Addendums are available through <a href="https://www.cityofbastrop.org">www.cityofbastrop.org</a> (when applicable) and in the City Secretary's office. Failure to return any and all issued addendums, if requested, may adversely affect the proposer's opportunity for award.

#### 5. MODIFICATIONS OR WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSAL

**Modification of Proposal**: Proposals may be modified in writing at any time prior to the due date and time.

<u>Withdrawal of Proposal</u>: Proposals may be withdrawn in writing or by facsimile (provided that the facsimile is signed by the proposer) at any time prior to the due date. A proposal may also be withdrawn in person by a proposer, provided the withdrawal is made prior to the due date. The proposer must sign a receipt of withdrawal.

No proposals may be withdrawn after the due date without forfeiture of the proposal security (if required), unless there is a material error in the proposal. Withdrawn proposals may be resubmitted, with or without modifications, up to the due date. The LGC and/or City may require proof of agency from person withdrawing proposal.

## 6. OPENING OF BIDS

The Public Works and/or Parks department representative responsible for opening proposals shall confirm the time and announce the proposal opening. The representative shall then personally and publicly open and read aloud all proposals received on time.

#### 7. EVALUATION FACTORS AND AWARD

**Evaluation**: Proposers may furnish pricing for all or any portion of the proposal (unless otherwise specified). However, the LGC and City may evaluate and award the contract for any item or group of items shown on the proposal, or any combination deemed most advantageous to the LGC and City. Proposals that specify an "all or none" award may be considered if a single award is advantageous.

<u>Award</u>: The LGC shall award the proposal to the lowest responsible proposer or to the proposer who provides goods or services at the best value for the LGC. When determining the "best value", the following criteria will be considered:

- Description of Contractor's experience in providing the services requested. Max. Value 20%
- Key personnel and proposed staffing plan. Max. Value 10%
- Inventory of materials, equipment and supplies to be used by the Contractor. Max. Value 10%
- A minimum of three (3) references from parties on whose behalf services of similar size and structure to the Scope of Work described in this RFP in the past five (5) years for clients with which the Contractor had two (2) or more years of successful service. Max. Value 20%
- Safety program and procedures. Max. Value 10%
- Price and sufficiency/completeness of bid information. Max. Value 30%

Total long-term cost may include specification conformance, delivery requirements, the life expectancy, cost of maintenance and operation, operating efficiency, training requirements, disposal value, warranties and other factors contributing to the overall acquisition cost of the product/services.

Acceptance of Proposal: Acceptance of a proposal for a one-time purchase will be in the form of a Purchase Order. Acceptance of a proposal for a supply or service agreement will also be in the form of a Purchase Order. Subsequent purchase releases may be issued as appropriate. The contents of a proposal shall become a part of the contract. Under no circumstances will the LGC or City be responsible for goods or services provided without an acceptance signed by an authorized LGC or City representative.

**Reservations**: The LGC expressly reserves the right to:

- 1. Specify approximate quantities in the proposal;
- Extend the proposal opening date and time:
- 3. Consider and accept alternate bids, if specified in the proposal documents, when most advantageous to the LGC;
- 4. Waive as an informality minor deviations from specifications, provided they do not affect competition or result in functionally unacceptable goods or services;
- 5. Waive any minor informality in any proposal or proposal procedure (a minor informality is one that does not affect the competitiveness of the proposer):

# What is H.B. 914?

# Does this include a person who buys city property?

# **Certificate of Interested Parties (Form 1295):**

In 2015, the Texas Legislature adopted House Bill 1295, which added section 2252.908 of the Government Code. The law states that a governmental entity or state agency may not enter into certain contracts with a

business entity unless the business entity submits a disclosure of interested parties to the governmental entity or

state agency at the time the business entity submits the signed contract to the governmental entity or state agency.

The law applies only to a contract of a governmental entity or state agency that either (1) requires an action or

vote by the governing body of the entity or agency before the contract may be signed or (2) has a value of at least\$1 million. The disclosure requirement applies to a contract entered into on or after January 1, 2016.


The Texas Ethics Commission was required to adopt rules necessary to implement that law, prescribe the

disclosure of interested parties form and post a copy of the form on the commission's website. The commission

adopted the Certificate of Interested Parties form (Form 1295) on October 5, 2015. The commission also adopted new rules (Chapter 46) on November 30, 2015, to implement the law. The commission does not have anyadditional authority to enforce or interpret House Bill 1295.

# **Filing Process:**

- (a) A disclosure of interested parties form required by section 2252.908 of the Government Code must be filed on an electronic form prescribed by the commission that contains the following:
  - (1) The name of the business entity filing the form and the city, state, and country of the business entity's place of business;
  - (2) The name of the governmental entity or state agency that is a party to the contract for which the form is being filed;
  - (3) The name of each interested party and the city, state, and country of the place of business of each interested party;
  - (4) The identification number used by the governmental entity or state agency to track or identify the contract for which the form is being filed and a short description of the goods or services used by the governmental entity or state agency provided under the contract; and
  - (5) An indication of whether each interested party has a controlling interest in the business entity, is an intermediary in the contract for which the disclosure is being filed, or both.
- (b) The certification of filing and the completed disclosure of interested parties form generated by the commission's electronic filing application must be printed, signed by an authorized agent of the contracting business entity, and submitted to the governmental entity or state agency that is the party to the contract for which the form is being filed
- (c) A governmental entity or state agency that receives a completed disclosure of interested parties form and certification of filing shall notify the commission, in an electronic format prescribed by the commission, of the receipt of those documents not later than the 30th day after the date the contract for which the form was filed binds all parties to the contract.

#### **EXHIBIT A**

# **SCOPE OF WORK**

Notwithstanding the general Scope of Work provided in this Section, the LGC, or the City as its representative, in its sole discretion, shall have the absolute right to limit or decrease the services provided by the successful bidder, at any time, and as necessary and in the best interest of the LGC. Accordingly, all bids submitted to the LGC shall be priced per individual service, as shown on the attached Bid Sheet.

# I. Mowing, Landscaping, and Irrigation

As shown on the map and technical specifications provided in Exhibit "B", the following areas of the Hunters Crossing Subdivision will require irrigation, landscaping, and mowing services, including weeding of all beds, around trees and drains, and trimming to include pruning, thinning out and shaping trees and shrubs in accordance with standard horticultural practice:

- a. 15' ROW setbacks along Hwy 71, FM 304: twelve (12) times a year.
- b. Outside Pool Fence and Pocket park: thirty-six (36) times a year.
- c. Hunters Crossing Blvd., Home Depot Way, Bear Hunter Drive and Hunters Point Drive: twenty-six (26) times a year.
- d. 3' Trail setbacks: twenty-six (26) times a year.
- e. Sports Fields: twenty-six (26) times a year.
- f. Two (2) Entrances: twenty-six (26) times a year.
- g. Drainage Easement Areas: twelve (12) times a year.
- h. Live Oak Tree trimming shall be performed one (1) time a year and under conditions necessary, including generally accepted seasonal conditions, to prevent harm and/or disease to the trees. Once the Oak Trees are trimmed, all cut branches shall be sealed with a prune sealer

All areas of the Property will be serviced so as to keep a neat and tidy appearance as follows.

- a. Pond Maintenance: four (4) times a year.
- b. Weed Control through hand weeding, as needed.
- c. Chemical Treatments, Fertilization, Weed Control, Herbicide, Fire Ant Control, as needed, but at a minimum, as follows.

Chemical treatments will include:

- 1. Fertilizing using a slow release fertilizer to be applies one (1) time a year.
- 2. Pre-emergent will be applied two (2) times per year.
- 3. Appropriate herbicide will be used to control weeds and invasive grass on the property

- 4. Mound treatment there (3) times a year
- d. Thirty (30) flats of color will be installed two (2) times a year between the two entrances of the Property.
- e. Mulching one (1) time a year, to a uniform depth of 2" of mulch (approximately 703 bags or 52 Cubic yards) will be applied to all appropriate areas including but not limited to shrub beds and tree walls.

# II. Additional Services to be Provided

- a. Maintain all plant, trees, shrubs and vines in a healthy, vigorous growing condition free from disease and pests.
- b. Maintain soil mulch as needed for an even and uniform appearance over visible soil surface.
- c. Replace annuals in all beds, as required.
- d. Prune all trees annually in the winter (with the exception of Live Oaks, treated as described above) to shape and train and prune dead branches as needed.
- e. Remove litter, broken or fallen branches, sucker growth, and leaves from grounds, as needed.
- f. Monitor and maintain water irrigation system.
